Focusing on the elements of color in clothing from the 17th century to the present moment, this exhibition was arranged in five sections—Black, Multicolor, Blue, Red & Yellow, and White—to produce a clearer picture of the characteristics of each piece of clothing, and to bring into relief the messages conveyed so strongly by color. Guest curators for *Fashion in Colors* were Viktor & Rolf, the design duo known for producing collections that shake the boundaries between art and fashion, making them widely sought after for contemporary art exhibitions around the world. This exhibition fully realizes the inherent attractiveness, fun, and strength of color in clothing.
